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LIGHTHOUSE BBC TO **OBSERVE LORD'S SUPPER ON MARCH 1, 8 AND 15**

"And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me. After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, This cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me. For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come" (1 Cor 11:24-26).

he 2nd ordinance of the Ekklesia, the Lord's Supper, will be observed by the whole Lighthouse BBC, including related works, on March 1, 8 and 15. The beautiful ordinance, is broken into three dates to pave the way for more members to be able to partake considering the physical distancing that has to be in effect, even at this time.

Our Lord Jesus had carefully instructed the Apostles in Matthew 28:20, by teaching everyone "to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you..." And in various passages, from the writers of the Gospels to the Apostle Paul, we received the instruction to observe this beautiful ordinance.

The Lord's Supper will be observed by districts according to the arrangements made by the Pastor's Men and the District Sentinels. Lighthouse Districts 1 and 2 on March 1; Lighthouse Districts 3 and 6 on March 8 and Lighthouse Districts 4 and 5 on March

Should any of our people find difficulty in the cited dates, our leaders may make necessary adjustments, only to accommodate more of our people to participate.

If we are to be a kind of church that is Biblical, we need to be consistent in what is taught for us to do and to obey. And from all of what the Lord Jesus had said, including that of the Apostles, we cannot but be responsible enough, and before the Lord to observe especially the commands so explicitly given to us, and this includes the Lord's Supper.

Let us therefore, be faithful and true as an Ekklesia of the Lord Jesus by joining the Lord's Supper. - PRA



TITLE: THE EKKLESIA THAT IS FAITHFUL AND TRUE. THE KIND OF MEMBERS THE FAITHFUL AND TRUE EKKLESIA HAS.

TFXT ·

Eph 4:20-21, "But ye have not so learned Christ; if so be that ye have heard him, and have been taught by him, as the truth is in Jesus."

INTRODUCTION

If we are to be faithful and true as an Ekklesia, being a body of Christ, a body of believers, there is nothing more important for us than to learn Christ and in learning, manifest the kind of works that He had designed for us to do.

Eph 2:10 explicitly tells us that we, as an Ekklesia, is one workmanship and that, as a creation in Christ, we have been made for good works. We should therefore be known for what we do. These works manifest the kind of people we should be and we should do. Our text, from Eph 4:20 to 5:21 describe to us the kind of people we should be as Ekklesia.

1) Believers who have put off the former conversation.

Eph 4:22, "That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts."

2) Believers who have been renewed (and are being renewed) in the spirit of their minds.

Eph 4:23. "And be renewed in the spirit of your mind."

3) Believers who have put on the new man.

Eph 4:24, "And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness."

4) Believers who put away lying.

Eph 4:25, "Wherefore putting away lying, speak every man truth with his neighbour: for we are members one of another."

5) Believers who have controlled temperament.

Eph 4:26-27, "Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath: neither give place to the devil."

6) Believers who are honest and generous.

Eph 4:28, "Let him that stole steal no more: but rather let him labour, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have to give to him that needeth."

7) Believers who are not offensive in words.

Eph 4:29, "Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers."

James 3:2-11, "For in many things we offend all. If any man offend not in word, the same is a perfect man,

and able also to bridle the whole body.

Behold, we put bits in the horses' mouths, that they may obey us; and we turn about their whole body.

Behold also the ships, which though they be so great, and are driven of fierce winds, yet are they turned about with a very small helm, whithersoever the governor listeth.

Even so the tongue is a little member, and boasteth great things. Behold, how great a matter a little fire kindleth!

And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity: so is the tongue among our members, that it defileth the whole body, and setteth on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire of hell.

For every kind of beasts, and of birds, and of serpents, and of things in the sea, is tamed, and hath been tamed of mankind:

But the tongue can no man tame; it is an unruly evil, full of deadly poison.

Therewith bless we God, even the Father; and therewith curse we men, which are made after the similitude of God. Out of the same mouth proceedeth blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not so to be. Doth a fountain send forth at the same place sweet water and bitter?"

8) Believers who are spiritual.

Eph 4:30-32, "And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption. Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice: and be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you."

9) Believers who walk consistently as children of God.

Eph 5:1-2, "Be ye therefore followers of God, as dear children; And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour."

Believers who are known by goodness, righteousness and truth.

Eph 5:3-10, "But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints; meither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient: but rather giving of thanks.

For this ye know, that no whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God. Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience. Be not ye therefore partakers with them. For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light: (For the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness and truth;) Proving what is acceptable unto the Lord."

11) Believers who intentionally live according to the light of Christ.

Eph 5:11-13, "And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them. For it is a shame even to speak of those things which are done of them in secret. But all things that are reproved are made manifest by the light: for whatsoever doth make manifest is light."

12) Believers who walk circumspectly and with wisdom.

Eph 5:15-17, "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is."

13) Believers who are filled with the Spirit.

Eph 5:18, "And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit."

14) Believers who minister.

Eph 5:19-20, "Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord..."
